




Quality is important for all stakeholders





# FRAUD MEASUREMENT

#### A candle in the dark



Before we can manage it, we need to find it

We'll find more if we look together than let it be passed around from one place to another

By working separately we actually act against each other and make things easier for fraudsters

Once found, recovery can be handled separately

Shouldn't really be a competitive factor: formation of NICE

Significant duplication of labour and resources – could be pooled

Public and private sectors, providers, funders, academia: alignment and cohesion

Funder choices and negotiations should remain their own









Births per year an Obstetrician needs to cover professional indemnity fees

#### PROFESSIONAL INDEMNITY

Keeping the cost of care sustainable

Increases costs for everyone in the system



Drives undesirable provider responses

- opt out of obstetrics or other specialization
- low risk patients
- less team work (who is responsible)
- more defensive medicine

Currently a (foreign) monopoly provider, with no transparency
