






2 X CO₂ = +3° to 4°C




The problem of value pluralism

The idea that there are several values which may be equally

correct and yet in conflict with one anothe objective ordering of them in term

Conflict	Example
Conflict between an insurer's stakeholders	Financial objectives (shareholders) vs reputational risk (policyholders/members)
Intergenerational: conflict between present and future generations	Must today's generations bear the costs of transition so that future generations may enjoy the benefits?
Intragenerational: conflict between members of the same generation	Countries experiencing extreme climate events vs those who benefited from the industrialisation which caused climate change
















Strokes





Asthma




- Higher temperatures that come with climate change also promote more ground-level ozone pollution.


